Yale's Former Football Star is Again "Downed" by Dan Cupid.

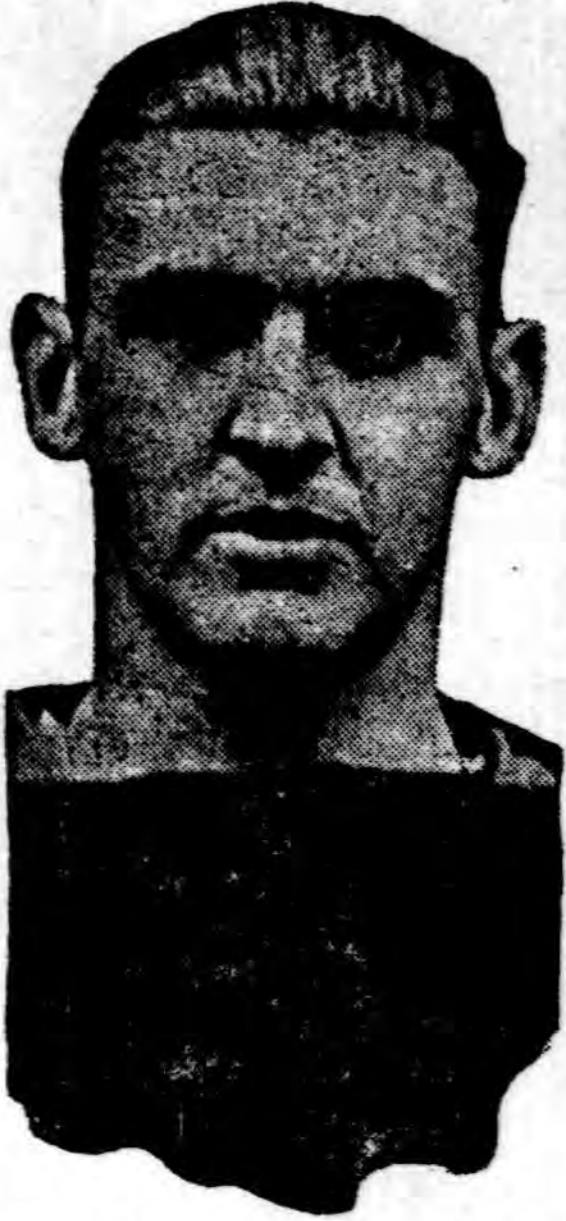

BRANDEIS UPHeld BY HIS ASSOCIATE

McClennen Indorses His Action in Warren Case.

Washington, March 4.—A detailed explanation of the Warren case and the litigation involved in the fight for the control of the Gillette Safety Razor company was presented by Louis D. Brandeis' law partner, Edward McClennen, to the senate committee which is investigating the fitness of Mr. Brandeis for appointment to the supreme court.

Members of the committee manifested some impatience at the delay in bringing the investigation to a close. Several times Mr. McClennen was admonished that his testimony referred to the litigation rather than Mr. Brandeis' relations with the litigants.

BIG COAST STORM RAGING.

Sixty Mile Wind at Hatteras Reported. Heavy Snowfall.

Norfolk, Va., March 4.—With the worst storm of the winter sweeping the coast, ships are in great danger. The wind at Hatteras blew at sixty miles from the northwest, and at Cape Henry the velocity was forty-eight miles and increasing.

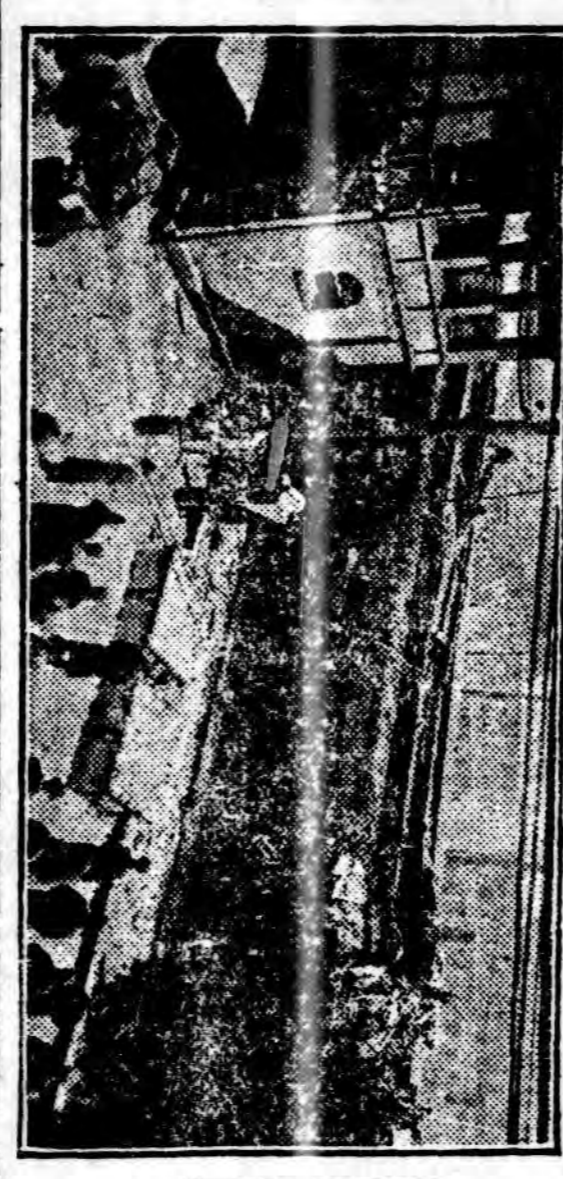
