

POLLING LOCATIONS

Harris County Elections utilized 99 Early Voting Locations and 782 Election Day Polling Locations for the 2022 General and Special Elections. At 782 Election Day Polling Locations, Harris County has 328 more than the next closest Texas county. Voters have the option to cast a ballot in-person at any Polling Location in the County.

Harris County is pleased to announce the next generation of voting machines to make voting more accessible and transparent to and for voters, the Verity Duo from Hart InterCivic.

Verity Duo combines the ease and accuracy of touchscreen ballot marking with the assurance of a voter-verifiable paper trail. Verity Duo prints an easy-to-read summary of voter choices for verification, and the scanner counts votes directly from this summary.

TRANSPORTING BALLOTS FOR TABULATION



For years, Harris County Elections has partnered with county law enforcement to conduct early voting drop-off, which is required by Texas Election Code. That effort has been expanded to include Election Day. At the end of Election Day, law enforcement and deputized Harris County employees collect equipment from polling locations to provide much-needed relief to election judges and workers who have worked a long day. Election Judges are given the choice to opt into this pick-up program or deliver the equipment themselves. All equipment from Early Voting and Election Day are transported to Central Count, which is located at NRG Arena Hall D for the November 8 Election.

CANVASS: FINALIZING THE VOTE



After Polling Locations close at 7 PM on Election Day, all voted ballots are sealed, secured, and transported to our Central County facility, which is located at NRG Arena (Hall D) for this election. Election Night results include Early Voting and Election Day ballots at the Polling Locations, as well as Mail Ballots received and processed up until Election Day.

FINALIZING THE OFFICIAL VOTE TALLY (CANVASS)

Counting ballots does not end on Election Night. The Harris County Elections Administrator's Office takes every effort to ensure that all ballots cast are counted. After Election Night, additional ballots including provisional ballots or ballots for military and overseas voters must still be processed. These ballots must be canvassed by Friday, November 18.



MAIL BALLOTS

WHAT ARE THE NEW ID REQUIREMENTS?

Texas Senate Bill 1 requires voters MUST provide their Texas Driver's License number, Texas Personal ID number, Election Identification Certificate number, or the last four digits of their Social Security Number on the mail ballot application.

WHICH FORM OF IDENTIFICATION ARE REQUIRED FROM VOTERS?

The identification you provide on your mail ballot application must match what is on file in your voter record. If the ID you provide does not match what is on file, your application will be rejected, meaning you will receive a letter of explanation along with a new application that you must fill out and return before the mail ballot application deadline. Failure to provide an exact match on the application to what is on your voter record could result in a rejection of the application, meaning voters will need to return a corrected mail ballot application before the mail ballot application deadline.

HOW CAN VOTERS AVOID DELAYS IN RECEIVING MY BALLOT?

- Call Harris County Elections at (713) 755-6965. The voter services team is dedicated to walking voters through the process of filling out applications. There are operators who are fluent in English, Spanish, Vietnamese, and Chinese.

- Provide both forms of ID. Even though the form only asks for one, the best way to ensure an application isn't rejected is to provide both a Texas ID and the last four digits of your Social Security Number.

- Provide a contact email or phone number on your application so our team can immediately reach out and address any issues with the application to minimize delays.
